John C. Fortier is a research associate at the American Enterprise Institute where he is executive director of the Continuity of Government Commission and project manager of the Transition to Governing Project. He is also a regular participant in "Election Watch," AEI's election analysis forum. Fortier is a political scientist. He has taught at Boston College, Harvard University, and the University of Delaware. Prior to coming to AEI, he was a research associate at the Worcester Municipal Research Bureau in Massachusetts.

Fortier is the executive director of the Continuity of Government Commission (Cutler-Simpson Commission. <u>www.continuityofgovernment.org</u>), which is studying how to ensure the constitutional continuity of government institutions after a terrorist attack. The commission was launched in the fall of 2002 and issued its first report on the continuity of Congress in the spring of 2003.

Fortier also serves as the project manager for the Transition to Governing Project, an AEI project in conjunction with the Brookings Institution and the Hoover Institution, funded by the Pew Charitable Trusts. The project aims to smooth the transition to campaigning to governing. It also focused attention on the governing qualities of the presidential candidates and on a president's transition into office. The project has published two books: *Preparing to be President: The Memos of Richard E. Neustadt* and *The Permanent Campaign and Its Future*.

He has published articles in the *Review of Politics*, *PS: Political Science and Politics*, University of Michigan Journal of Law Reform, Brookings Review, Extensions (a journal of the legislative studies section of the APSA) and *State Legislatures Magazine*. Recently, he has authored chapters in White House World: Transitions, Organization, and Office Operations (Texas A&M Press, February 2003) and The Bush Presidency (Johns Hopkins University Press, 2003). He has also delivered numerous papers at the American Political Science Association, Southern Political Science Association and New England Political Science Association annual meetings. He has published opinion pieces in the Roll Call, The American Enterprise, Newark Star Ledger, New York Times Upfront, TechCentralStation, and the Washington Times. He is working on a book on the electoral college and is conducting research on election reform, the continuity of congress, the presidential transition, Congress, and the Presidency. Fortier has provided commentary for BBC radio and television, CTV (Canadian Television), Fox News, National Public Radio "Morning Edition," Newsweek On Air, Hearst-Argyle television, Medill News Service television, Danish television, Dutch radio, WBUR radio (NPR Boston), WAMU (NPR Washington), WAVA, WNYC (New York Public Radio), Texas Public Radio, Wisconsin Public Radio, C-SPAN and the Catholic Radio Network. He holds a B.A. from Georgetown University and a Ph.D. in political science from Boston College.
