Rick Stream Biography

Mr. Stream is a lifelong resident of Kirkwood who began working at the age of 11 to support his large family, especially after his father passed away in 1963. He is a graduate of Kirkwood High School '67, Meramec Community College '69 and the University of Missouri - St. Louis '71.

Mr. Stream served as a U.S. Naval Officer from 1971 to 1975, assigned to the USS Fort Snelling (LSD-30). Upon his honorable discharge, he returned to Kirkwood and worked as a supervisor at a nearby cotton factory. In 1977, he began a 29-year career as a Department of Defense Budget and Program Manager for the Army Aviation and Logistics Commands. During that time, he also was on the Kirkwood School Board for 12 years; 2 as its president.

Mr. Stream retired early in 2006 to run for Missouri State Representative, and he was elected four times; serving as the House Budget Committee Chair and Vice-Chair for 6 years. Mr. Stream has been the Republican Director of Elections for the St. Louis County Election Board since January 2017.
